### **Boy Scout Oath or Promise**

On my honor, I will do my best To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; To help other people at all times; To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake and morally straight. Note that the Boy Scout Oath has traditionally been considered to have three promises. Those three promises are delineated by the semicolons in the Oath, which divide it into three clauses. The three promises of the Scout Oath are, therefore:

- Duty to God and country,
- Duty to other people, and
- Duty to self

**DUTY TO GOD AND COUNTRY:** Your family and religious leaders teach you to know and serve God. By following these teachings, you do your duty to God.

Men and women of the past worked to make America great, and many gave their lives for their country. By being a good family member and a good citizen, by working for your country's good and obeying its laws, you do your duty to your country. Obeying the Scout Law means living by its 12 points.

**DUTY TO OTHER PEOPLE:** Many people need help. A cheery smile and a helping hand make life easier for others. By doing a Good Turn daily and helping when you're needed, you prove yourself a Scout and do your part to make this a better world.

**DUTY TO SELF: Keeping yourself physically strong** means taking care of your body. Eat the right foods and build your strength. **Staying mentally awake** means learn all you can, be curious, and ask questions. Being **morally straight** means to live your life with honesty, to be clean in your speech and actions, and to be a person of strong character.

#### **Committee Reports:**

A. Finance:

Total: \$6,625.59 (including money owed to NTier)

Scouts: \$2,011.05 (scouts)

Troop: \$4,614 \$ (including money owed to NTier)

#### **B. New Business**

- Flag ceremony at Elks Lodge on May 3. We need 1 adult + 4 scouts
- New scouts
  - Four new scouts will be bridging from Pack 87 this month.
  - Troop 87 needs a few Scouts to help with the bridging ceremony.
  - Participants are welcome to join the Blue and Gold Banquet before the bridging ceremony.
- District has a new membership chairman working on recruiting
- Recharter
  - Dawn will email an updated roster after adding the new scouts who are bridging over from Pack 87 this month
  - Kim reported that Troop 87 is once again the first troop to finish their FOS drive and hit their goal.
- Journey to Excellence:
  - We will discuss the requirements for "2 areas of improvement" at the March committee meeting
- Troopmaster software
  - Our license expires May'15
  - Renewal fees
    - Local copy of troopmaster: 1 year \$30; 3 years = \$50
    - Troopmaster.net allowing cloud access: 1 year \$25; 3 years = \$55
  - Matt motioned to purchase 3 year licenses at a total of \$105. Chuck seconded. The motion carried.
- Summer camp at BDSR Camp Jeffries [July 12-18]
  - Robert Acker will attend.
  - Matt and Doug are looking for a second adult for BDSR summer camp
  - Kim has made reservations for six scouts and two adults. It's easy to add more if additional people would like to attend.
  - Scouts need to commit for summer camp by the March committee meeting
- Boundary waters payment #4 is due tonight
  - Ground Transportation: 2 cars and 1 van reserved
  - Matt will take care of air transportation this week (flying July 10<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>)

- Leader training Jax will offer Wilderness First Aid training at the end of Feb. Matt has information and will send a link to the adults going on this trip.
- Payment schedule \$200 due on Nov 4, Feb 3, 2015, May 5,2015 plus additional travel expenses
- Leaders (4) [Doug, Matt], [Sean, Chuck]
- Scouts (9) [Evan, Josh, Cole, Max], [Andrew D, Holden M, Chance B, Van D, Blake R]
- Health forms for summer camps
  - Need to make sure scouts and parents are aware of the requirements for both camps
- Nursery fundraiser
  - Last year we collected \$358, which included selling food. This worked out to \$7.68/hour for the scouts.
  - Bev will contact FC Nursery and let them know that we are interested again this year.
  - We could also pursue potting plants for other nurseries as many groups find this to be a very good fundraiser
- Pancake Breakfast fundraiser
  - The troop made over \$580, largely because the Elks covered all the expenses
  - For tickets sold at the door, the troop took 20% and the rest was divided by the scouts who worked that day.
  - After discussion, the committee decided that we would like to hold this fundraiser again in 2015.
  - Regarding possible dates for the event, there was discussion about the weekend on
    either side of Veteran's Day. There was also discussion around selling tickets when the
    scouts are volunteering for the Memorial Day event.
- King Soopers Cards update
  - We got another check in December and Sean gave the check to Kim. We are currently at \$4700 and we'll get another check at \$5000.
  - This is a great fundraiser for scout families. If you shop for groceries or gas at King Soopers (or Loaf and Jug), you can get a renewable card from Sean Dougherty.
- Dawn will order business cards
- Trailer maintenance
  - We plan to add plywood, shelves, and flag holders in the trailer
  - We need to reorganize the trailer before Spring Camporee
- The Aspen Elks Lodge would like for Troop 87 to send a scout to NYLT (National Youth Leaders Training).
  - Jun 7-13. The \$250 fee has already paid, so this would be a free trip for one lucky scout.
  - NYLT is similar to Wood Badge, but it's for youth. It's run by Scouts with adult mentors
    for that youth staff. It's a week-long event with participants are broken into patrols. It's
    focused on leadership skills, presentation skills, etc, and includes an Outpost campout for
    two days.
  - It was expanded from 48 to 56 scouts this year.
  - Dick Miller, Elks Lodge in Aspen, asked if Troop 87 could have a name by the end of this week.
- Scott Addington reported that there continues to be legal action against the Council due to the bike accident that occurred during a Troop 87 event in 2012.
  - Our local council and the national BSA groups are involved.
