#### August 2017 Committee Meeting Notes – 08/01/2017

<u>In attendance</u>: Caroline, Cindy Tunney, Ariella Wells, Doug Birlingmair, Todd Massey, Bob Grimmer, Chuck Yung, Matthew Condell

- 1. Should Dorsch's be reimbursed for lawn mowing expenses \$73.50. Cindy brought forward motion. Doug seconded motion. All voted yes to vote to reimburse them.
- Evan Tunney: Eagle project presentation. Search and rescue wants Evan to build wall that will work to help with training the dogs and also take to events and presentation. 2<sup>nd</sup> portion – dog collars made out of paracord.

Begin time he is hoping for soon. End time he's is aiming for end of September but has until December. 5-10 people needed for this project. He is hoping to recruit troop and family members to help out. Communicate clearly how things should be constructed so as to not waste time and materials. Materials 2 4x6 sheets plywood 45 degree Y intersection of pvc 45 degree elbow Also mesh or fabric square for top hole Roughly 40 feet paracord per dog collar, want 20 collars, so 800 feet total 20 D rings 20 easy release buckles, so collar can guickly be snapped off if they get stuck Lunch for all his helpers Gas for transportation Garbage bag First aid kit Safety goggles Sunscreen Ez up for shade Work gloves for working with wood Lighter Scissors Whole saw Hand saw Drill for screws

Estimated hours: he is not sure yet.

Suggestion made to put together 3 ring binder and some index tabs to keep things organized and for presentation purposes.

He is going to make Printed instructions for dog collars. He is going to design plans for the wall with 3d plans and software.

He is hoping to get donations of materials to get his project together and not need money.

Estimated cost of materials \$215.64

Plans to seek donations of actual materials from businesses such as Lowe's, Home Depot, Jax. If he can't raise all the materials will look into ways of raising money.

Logistics: he will transport stuff to the work day. Volunteers will transport themselves to work day. Expecting no major injuries. Possible injuries – cuts, scrapes, burns. Adults will handle power tools as is designated by safe scouting regulations. He will schedule his work days after he gets some of the fundraising started. S and R did not are how far apart the holes were. He will check with them to see if they are going to store outside or inside so he knows if they need to have some kind of stain or something on it.

Doug B. motions to approve to allow Evan to present his project to Mr. Noon. Bob seconded motion. All in attendance voted to pass the motion and allow Evan to present his project.

- 3. June 6 meeting notes review. Chuck Yung made motion to approve minutes. Bob G. seconded motion. All in attendance voted vocally to approve the motion and June minutes are approved.
- 4. Cole Yung Eagle Scout presentation: He presented his written copy and is in need of signatures. He has not spoken with Mr. Noon yet. Bob G. recommended a spread sheet of hours to present to Mr. Noon as he likes to see that the project will be ok for an Eagle. Planning to seek donations from Ace, Lowes, Forks, Home Depot. He turns 18 end of March. He would like to have project done end of October/early November. He would like to have all his merit badges done by x-mas time. He is planning on building 2 cubbies. 14 inches x 15 inches 2 to 2 ½ feet deep. Each of the cubbies are going to be 5 feet long, 42 inches tall. He is going to build it at his house and then transport it.
- 5. Accepting debit cards for fundraisers: Caroline can't be one responsible for this. She is asking for someone to be responsible to take this on.
- 6. August through October schedule (Included Above)
- 7. Popcorn sales: need to have kickoff for popcorn sale added to calendar. Needs to know who is going to sell and who is not going to sell so Cindy knows how to order for popcorn sale. She would like to know if she should buy ahead of time or not buy ahead of time. Pre buying or not, could affect discounts for summer camp. Based on camp cards and popcorn sales. Discount is \$25 to \$40. Could organize trip to neighborhood so group can go out together and sell. Pick a day and see who signs up.
- 8. **High Adventure Camp:** still no vote on which camp they are going to do. Have to know what they are going to do before January.
- 9. Merit Badge Counselor: person at counsel who was making renewals happen was volunteer and is no longer helping out. Merit badge counselors need to renew their registration on their own. Need to turn in form on your own. Longs Peak council and look under forms for merit badge council form. Need to do adult app. Need to provide youth protection training cert and mailed in (if new). Give to Mr. Birlingmair. If just renewing making sure have YPT, fill out form that you get online and make box that says you are renewing and give to Mr. Birlingmair. He will mail them in. If you have an interest or do it for your job that is all you need to be a merit badge counselor. He will send out current list of who is in counselor for what.
- 10. **Roster:** updated when recharter was done by Ryann H. Need to get new information on for new scouts. Everyone who went to summer camp info is updated. Those that did not come to summer camp are not done.
