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COMMITTEE MEETING OCTOBER 3, 2017

Eliyahu and Wyatt Massey to talk with Haunted houses to see if there are any that they could potentially volunteer at for one night as a group. They should report back by 10/10. If no location can be identified by 10/10, the backup activity is pumpkin carving. Eliyahu responsible for coordinating supplies, etc. Cindy also suggested Nocturnal Nightmares, a neighbor of hers who may be willing to show them some of the electronic side of things.
